Department of Planning and Community Development

Monthly Activity Report March 2016

During the month of March 2016, this office continually answered phone calls pertaining to permit information, realtor requests, zoning information and other various Planning and Community Development issues. All seventy-eight building, electrical, plumbing, shoreland zoning, and complaint inspections were performed by Nicholas L. Adams (CEO).

There was a total of **22** building, gravel pit and shoreland zoning permits, **1** road entrance, **15** electrical permits, **3** septic system permit, and **7** internal plumbing permits issued with a total cost of work of \$709,800 for the month of March. I have attached the permit breakdown for the month.

The Planning Board is proposing seven (7) amendments to the Comprehensive Land Use Code to be considered at the annual Town meeting on April 2nd. Copies of the amendments can be found online and in the Planning and Community Development Office.

The Planning Board considered a one lot subdivision amendment application for the "Kinney Woods" subdivision off Estes Way, and approved a Site Plan application for Nestle Waters of North America for new carbon towers intended for water filtration.

The Board of Appeals approved a side line variance for 920 Empire Road on March 28th.

There was **6** Certificate of Occupancies issued for the month of March.

Alex and I attended **2** Planning Board and **1** Board of Appeals meetings during the month of March.

This office accrued around **15 hours** of FOAA requests for the month of March.


